## IPM statement

It is the goal of RIVER DELTA UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT to implement IPM by focusing on long-term prevention or suppression of pests through accurate pest identification, by frequent monitoring for pest presence, by applying appropriate action levels, and by making the habitat less conducive to pests using sanitation and mechanical and physical controls. Pesticides that are effective will be used in a manner that minimizes risks to people, property, and the environment, and only after other options have been shown ineffective.

Our pest management objectives are to: *(Example: Focus on long-term pest prevention)*

TO IDENTIFY AND ELIMINATE AREAS THAT ENCOURAGE PESTS. TO USE THE LEAST TOXIC TO REMOVE PESTS WHEN PRESENTS, SUCH AS BAITS AND CRACKS AND CREVICE TREATMENTS. REDUCE THE AMOUNT OF PESTICIDES USED SO AS TO REDUCE EXPOSURE TO STUDENTS AND STAFF. TO CONTINUALLY MONITOR AND IDENTIFY PESTS AND USE PESTICIDES ONLY WHEN NECESSARY.
